GERMAN CHOCOLATE CAKE COOKIES

Ingredients

1 box German chocolate cake mix


- 2 eggs
- 1/3 cup oil

2 cups <u>chocolate chips</u> (divided)

1 can coconut pecan frosting

Here's how to make it:

- 1. Combine the cake mix, eggs, oil and 1 cup of the chocolate chips. Mix well.
- 2. Drop by spoonfuls onto cookie sheets. Press with your fingers to flatten a little.
- 3. Bake in a preheated 350-degree F oven for about 8 to 9 minutes. Remove from oven and allow to cool on the pan a few minutes before removing to aluminum foil or a cooling rack.
- 4. While the cookies cool, melted the remaining chocolate chips in microwave. Do this in 30-second intervals, stirring between each one, until smooth.
- 5. When the cookies are completely cool, top each one with some of the pecan-coconut icing and then drizzle with the melted chocolate.

Wow what a year! How time flies. I want to thank all for a great year. We were able to convert a branch club to a regular club.


We add one new club O'Fallon Titans. I wish we could bottle and pass along the enthusiasm this club has shown.



S-U-C-C-E-S-S is the preferred spelling for Service in District 26-M5. The planned District 19 ervice goals for thís year include LCI Global Causes and providing help to multiple geographic areas within the district. The District GST strives to propose service project ideas that are affordable, obtainable, and enjoyable. Each year, one project and recipient is scheduled for each quarter. In conjunction with the continuing project, Mercy Road, which is now in its third year, District Lions were notified of the service projects by newsletter and at meetings. Members then collected and brought needed items to cabinet meetings to be dispersed. The GST traveled to club meetings to share service goals, encourage service participation, and pick up project items for delivery. Lions are committed to helping the blind and visually impaired. As part of that commitment, CCVI (Children's Center for the Visually Impaired) was helped by collecting school supplies. Donated were 331 school items including glue sticks, crayons, markers, notebooks, scissors, playdoh, and paints for this project. The second quarter project was the collection of hats, gloves, and mittens. Those 272 items were delivered prior to winter to a home for children ages 2-18. The children live on campus in group homes with foster families. The thank you notes received from the children and foster parents were heartwarming. Collecting food and personal ítems for those ín need was the thírd quarter goal. The ítems were donated to the Starfísh Project to use in preparing blessing bags for the homeless and people in shelters. Lions donated 667 items and also made fleece blankets at the District Convention for donation. Mercy Road, 26-M5's continuous project, provides for the collection of Hot Wheels cars for Children's Mercy Hospital in Kansas City. This year, the District GST modified the name to Mercy Road-e-o and used a rodeo theme to show progress on our service goals poster. This supports the goal of striving to do fun, enjoyable projects. The GST traveled the road and visited clubs to educate members about District Service and gather support. Clubs won rodeo prizes of bandanas and stick horses for donating to achieve and promote our goals. Many Lions said they could personally relate to the hospitalized children because of family members and friends who had been patients. Parents and hospital staff shared comments telling how the cars were an incentive to help a child face an appointment, and were a comfort and distraction during a dreaded procedure. The goal for this project was to collect 2200 cars and donate a total of 7500 over three years. This goal was met and revised early in the year! Service doesn't end. Our Goal now is 10,000 Because of the hearts and strong beliefs of Lions that they can improve their communities and the world, the service goals

poster required an addition to reflect the new goal. It seemed appropriate to add "I BELIEVE". We must believe in, work together, and find ways to spell Service S-U-C-C-E-S-S.

Become a Host Family: Is Hosting Right for Me?

Youth Camps & Exchange

Are you interested in learning about other cultures and ways of life while sharing your own customs and experiences? Are open-mindedness, tolerance and cultural competence of high importance to you? Do you have a desire to contribute towards peace, international understanding, and the creation of young global citizens? If you answered yes to any of these questions, you may enjoy being a host family for the Youth Camp and Exchange Program (YCE)!

⇒ Benefits of Hosting

Hosting a young person from another country is a fulfilling experience and has many benefits:

- You experience the joy of sharing your culture and daily customs
- You learn about your visitor's customs and culture
- You open a new world of possibilities and thinking to a young person
- You make a new friend maybe a friend for life

⇒ What to Expect

Youth participants are usually between the ages of 15 and 22, and come from any of the more than 200 countries and geographic locations where there are Lions clubs. He/she will have completed an admissions process before being accepted to participate in the program. He/she may or may not know the language of your country but will have a desire to learn. Host families should include the participant in their daily routine, including family meals, as YCE is intended to be an immersive learning experience. Local excursions are not required of host families, but the host Lions club often arranges for participants to visit local points of interest and engage in social activities, like picnics and get-togethers.

\Longrightarrow Host Family Eligibility

The host Lions club must approve all host families. To be eligible to become a host family you must:

- Have regular contact with youth of the approximate age of the participant
- Be familiar with Lions clubs and the goals of YCE
- Be able to provide a bed and meals for your guest
- Follow all local laws related to youth protection

⇒ How to Apply

Apply to become a host family today by contacting your <u>local Lions club</u>. Or submit a <u>host family application</u> to your local Lions club for review.

Once an exchange is confirmed, you and your guest will correspond via e-mail, mail or telephone. You should also attend an orientation provided by the host Lions club. This orientation will help prepare you for one of the most exciting experiences of your life, and answer any questions you may have about the exchange program.

Topics may include:

- Cultural tolerance
- Cultural adaptation (including host family relations)
- Host family role
- Rules and logistics, along with other pertinent information about Lions clubs
- Role of sponsor Lions club and host Lions club and districts
- Travel
- Visas and passports
- Immunizations
- Insurance


