IMPORTANT INFORMATION--Ballot for State Convention Election, Please Read Carefully

Official Ballot Lions Multiple District 26 Constitution and By-Laws April 23, 2023

Proposition 1:

That all references to "Missouri Lions All-State (or All State) Band" in the Table of Contents, in Constitution, Article VIII, Sections 1 (d), 2 (e) and (l) and in By-Laws, Article VIII, Sections 5 be amended to read "Missouri Lions Band".

Purpose: Provide flexibility in the "fielding" of a band to represent Multiple District 26 (Missouri) at State and/or international functions.

Shall this proposition be adopted? [] YES [] NO

Requires a two-thirds affirmative vote for adoption.

Proposition 2: That Constitution ARTICLE VIII (Committees), Sections 2 and 4 be amended as follows:

Section 2: That a new sub-section (q) be added to read:

- (q) State Office Committee The council shall appoint a multiple district state office committee to oversee and assist in the operating of a State Lions administrative office. This committee shall be responsible to hire employees to fill any vacancies or needs and shall adjust hours according to the workload. All changes to employee adjusted hours should stay within the budget as set by the Council of Governors unless approved ahead of time. The State Office Committee shall be responsible for updating and making needed changes to the Personnel Manual. All updates and changes shall be approved by the Council of Governors.
- There will be three (3) members serving on this committee. The Council chairperson will serve an ex officio member of the committee. Due to the unique nature of this committee, it is not necessary that each district be represented on this committee, but the members will be from three different districts.
- The members of the State Office Committee shall be selected for a three-year term and may serve multiple terms. Such selection of members of the State Office Committee shall be made at the first Council of Governors meeting in July. Those Lions interested in seeking a position on the State Office Committee shall submit notice of their interest to their District Governor prior to the time for selecting the committee members. The notice of their interest may be sent by email, USPS, or personally to their District Governor. The Council will not be responsible for failure of delivery.

In July 2023 only, one member will be appointed for a one-year term, one member will be appointed for a two-year term and the remaining member will be appointed for the full three-year term. This will help to facilitate and provide for consistent operation of the State Office.

Section 4: That a new sub-section (d) be added to read:

(d) State Office Committee

Purpose: To add State Office Committee to list of State Committees, and define appointment procedures. Shall this proposition be adopted? [] YES [] NO Requires a two-thirds affirmative vote for adoption.

Proposition 3:

Throughout the Constitution **and** By-Laws; that the committee make all noted gender specific references (he, his, chairman, etc.) to read "he/she", "his/her", "chairperson", etc., and that the committee make other noted editorial (format, spelling, organizational titles, etc.) corrections.

Purpose: To correct format and spelling errors and remove gender specific wording. Shall this proposition be adopted? [] YES [] NO Requires a two-thirds affirmative vote for adoption.

Proposition 4:

That the third sentence Article II of these By-Laws be amended and a fourth sentence be added to read: "A meeting of the district governors of the multiple district who will be in office during the term of the council chairperson appointed shall be called following the <u>final Council of Governors meeting*</u>, or at the multiple district annual convention, but no later than 30 days following the closing of the International Convention for the purpose of selecting a council chairperson. *In the event the Council should "recess" the <u>final meeting pending a final session to follow the Annual Convention</u>, then the meeting may be held during the recess." [Underlined words to be added.]

Purpose: Provide flexibility in the timing of the meeting for the appointment of Council Chairperson. Shall this proposition be adopted? [] YES [] NO Requires a majority affirmative vote for adoption.

Lion Jennie Mosher was elected to serve at the February 25th District Convention in Farmington, Missouri. She will be inducted as the District Governor at the 2022 Lions Club International Convention in Montreal, Canada at the end of June. Membership in Lions Club International Organization started in January 2005 for Lion Jennie Mosher when she joined the Lebanon Host lions Club. After 5 years with the club she transferred to the Lebanon Evening Club where she continued her community service. When she relocated to Rolla, Missouri to be closer to her daughter and was asked to be the District Cabinet Secretary in Feb. of 2018 she joined the St. James Lions Club. However, not every Lions Club operates the same way. Then in June of 2019, after being approached by the incoming president of the Rolla Lions Club, Lion Jennie became the first lady Lion in a club that had been all men for 84+ years. Membership in this club has been a perfect for her as she stays very busy with local club activities. Her activities in the Rolla Lions Club include the following; editor of their monthly club newsletter, Leader Cook Team #5, desse chief on Cook Tea, #3, member of the Craft Festival Team and Annual Lions Club Carnival group participant. These are just a few of Lion Jennie's club activities; sh also chairs several District Committees in addition to serving as the District Globa Leadership Development Coordinator. She is a certified Faculty Leadership Development Instructor which has helped her develop learning classes for Lions within her own district. The most recent accomplishment was to chair the 2022 Missouri Lions State Convention which was held in Rolla, Missouri. This Missour Lions State Convention was very special as the Multiple District celebrated "100" years of Service" by our organization. In recognition of her service to the organization, Lion Jennie as received the Presidential Leadership Medal, the Certified Guiding Lion Medal and 8 Presidential Certificates of Appreciation. Lic Jennie is a Melvin Jones Fellow and received the Dalstrom Award from Mid-South Lions Sight and Hearing Service where she served on the Board of Trustees for 6

years. She was Trustee Chair for 5 years before serving her last year as the executive secretary of Mid-South Lions Sight and Hearing Service. Her service to this organization ended when Lion Jennie was elected to serve as District 26-M1 2nd Vice District Governor at the 2020 District Convention in Sikeston, Missouri. In addition, Lion Jennie will serve as the Multiple District vice-council chair for 2022-2023 lion year. Serving in this position, Lion Jennie will serve on the board of Saving Sight during her year as vice counsel chair.



We are very appreciative of the Saving Sight grant that allowed us to purchase them the two devices. The final cost was \$15,960. By purchasing two devices on the same order, the overall price was reduced by \$1,440.

Once I had to resign due to work obligations that made it impossible for me to attend meetings regularly. The last time I resigned because we moved to Washington, Missouri and the commute for weekly meetings was not feasible. I was named Lion of the Year in Joliet in 1990. In 1996 Joliet Noon Lions recognized me with a Melvin Jones Fellowship. We moved to Washington, Missouri in 1995 after retiring from Copley Newspapers as Vice President of Fox Valley Press. I became a member of the Washington Board of Directors in 1997, served as chair of the Super Bowl BBQ and other committees. I served as president of Washington Lions 2001-2002. Served as recording secretary, newsletter editor for Washington and District 26-M2. Have served on the District 26-M2 Eye Foundation Board for 12 years and currently act as treasurer. Washington Lions honored me as Lion of the year in 2008. Washington Lions also recognized me with a progressive Melvin Jones Fellowship and I now have four diamonds. I have been recognized with several Presidential Appreciation Certificates and in 2021 was awarded the Presidential Award for Service. After going on two Eye Mission trips to Mexico and Panama with the Lions in Sight of California and Nevada I and two others formed the Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation a 501 C(3) corporation. We continue to sponsor mission trips to those areas in

conjunctions with LiSCN and are attempting to begin missions in areas of Missouri where there is a need. I was asked to become 1st VDG by the PDG organization when one Lion had to resign as 1st VDG due to a move out of state. I accepted the position November of 2021. Montreal is the sixth International convention I have attended and I am looking forward to Boston, Mexico City and Australia. If you want more info let me know.

Missouri School for the Blind and a group of visually impaired are also looking at forming a new club. Who better to know about Lions than employees and residents from the school. There is still a great deal of work to be done, but it is an exciting time. November 6, M2 and M3 Lions volunteered with the Missouri Lions Eye Mission Foundation to hold the first eye mission in the state at St. Peter's and Paul Church in Soulard. We screened 27 homeless people there, none of which had anything close to normal vision and provided recycled eyeglasses to all. Two had cataracts that are now being removed and one had glaucoma and has been provided medication to keep it from progressing. This may be the start of more missions in Missouri and a partnership with the archdiocese of St. Louis as a part of their rural medical clinic group. Keep collecting those eyeglasses because we are now using them in our own state. If you know of a good place where there is a need for an eye missions, contact myself or Lion IPDG Devin Struttmann to start the process. All of us are busy with children or grandchildren sporting events, dance recitals not to mention church activities and our own recreational activities. Just remember there are plenty of opportunities to take an hour or two to reach out and help those who have less than we do or maybe need assistance that could be a simple as a ride to a doctor's appointment. and state.



First Missouri Eye Mission conducted by volunteers from M2 and M3 at St. peter and Paul Church in Soulard.




