

Lions Club International Foundation LCIF

I want to thank all clubs who have donated to LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION. In MD-26 gifts have ranged from \$20 to several thousand. All are needed and much appreciated by LCIF (our foundation).

Seven months have now gone in our lionistic year. Totals given by 73 clubs out of the 363 clubs in MD-26 totaled \$38,976.00. This amounts to 20.68% of clubs in MD26 donating to LCIF. OUR OWN INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION. MD-26 has received over two million dollars in grants from LCIF since it's inception, so it can't be said LCIF money only goes elsewhere in the world. Much has come to Missouri. The most recent example of grants are those in Cape Girardeau, Joplin, Kansas City, and Missouri Lions Eye Research Foundation (now Saving Sight).

Two years ago total MD-26 giving for 2012/13 was \$115,000. Last year, 2013/14, the total was \$105,000. I think it is safe to say that we could do better. The last lionistic year a letter to all clubs president was sent with information on LCIF and encouraging them to contact the LCIF coordinator in their district for presentations to their club. There was some direct replies received and there will be another letter sent to this year's club presidents. The district coordinators are listed in district directories however I am also listing them in this article.

I would ask clubs who have not donated to consider doing so. Just as an example, if all 280 clubs who have not yet donated would donate an average of \$300 we would have a total for all clubs of \$123,000 which would surpass any previous total by approximately \$7,000. I know not all clubs can donate \$300 but others can do more, so help your LCIF Foundation with what you can. Let's remember the quote of Helen Keller which reminds us that alone we can only do so much, together we can accomplish so much more, (not her exact wording) but I'm sure you get the point.





HOW TO RECEIVE SERVICE FROM MID-SOUTH LIONS SIGHT AND HEARING SERVICE



You will need to complete an application for service when sponsoring a patient to the Mid-South Lions Sight and Hearing Service. There are separate applications for sight and hearing, please use the appropriate application. The federal financial guidelines to qualify for our service are listed on the other side of this and must be strictly followed. Unless there are extenuating circumstances (there are very few exceptions such as medical bills or recent unemployment) patients whose income is greater than the guidelines cannot be considered for service.

Due to the increased cost of hearing aids, ALL hearing applications must be accompanied by a \$250 check to cover the cost of one hearing aid. Hearing aids are limited to one per patient, per year unless two hearing aids are prescribed by our audiologist. The club must decide whether to fund two hearing aids (\$500) if so prescribed. If a hearing aid is not prescribed, the club has the option of a refund, holding it for their next hearing patient, or allowing Mid-South to keep the funds as a club contribution.

The main sight clinic is located on the 2nd floor of the Hamilton Eye Institute at 930 Madison Avenue in Memphis. Additional satellite clinics and specialty clinics (prosthetics, retinas) are located throughout the four-state area (see application for details). The Methodist hearing clinic is located on the Ground floor of the Tower at Methodist University Hospital, 1265 Union Avenue in Memphis. A second location for hearing is the Memphis Speech and Hearing Clinic at 807 Jefferson Ave in Memphis. And we have added another location for hearing at the Bella Vista Hearing Center, 22 Sugar Creek Center, Bella Vista, AR. The hospital and clinics require proof of current income, such as a copy of the patient's current income tax return or a copy of the patient's last paycheck or social security check. It is also important for you to make a copy of the application for your Club's records.

The interviewing Lion should meet with the patient and complete the form *totally*, then mail it to the Mid-South office. We will notify the patient and the interviewing Lion as to whether or not the patient has been approved for service, and if approved when and where their first appointment will be. It will be up to the patient and the interviewing Lion to arrange transportation. At this time there is a somewhat lengthy waiting period to get an appointment and/or surgery. Please be sure to include *all* the information requested on the form. It is important that you fill out the form completely. Incomplete forms will cause unnecessary delays in processing of the application. Please mail the application and applicable attachments to the Mid-South office, not the clinic. Faxing applications will not expedite the process. The patient's first visit to Mid-South is for evaluation purposes ONLY. Please do not expect surgery on the first visit. Also, after hours emergency service is not available through Mid-South Lions.

If you have a patient who needs urgent care please call the office directly at 888-LION-042 (888-546-6042). If we determine that it is indeed an emergency case and the patient qualifies for service, we will do everything we can to get the patient seen at one of our clinics as soon as possible.

Anyone making more than this is considered OVER SCALE by the United States government guidelines, which the hospital must follow. However, the Mid-South Lions Sight and Hearing Service staff examines each case on an individual basis. Barring extenuating circumstances, each Lions Club should see that these guidelines are met.

The hospital requires that all sponsored patients provide proof of their current income. This may be in the form of a current income tax return or a copy of the last payroll check or Social Security checks.

If the patient is a minor, they MUST be accompanied by one of the parents or a legal guardian.

The income requirement standards on this form are subject to change as government guidelines change.



continues week after week throughout the school year to keep the growing youngsters happy and healthy.

To date we have assembled over 1550 Buddy Packs. It's a fun service project and rewarding in knowing that children will be provided nutritious supplements for growing healthy, strong, minds and bodies.

Want to help distribute recycled eyeglasses to people abroad who need them?

Saving Sight has collaborated with Lions leaders to coordinate two Lions Mission Clinics in 2015. In cooperation with Lions In Sight of California and Nevada, Saving Sight is pleased to announce the dates for this year's mission clinics in 2015.

1) For those who have never experienced an eyeglass mission clinic, we have been offered a trip to Toluca City, Mexico (about 50 miles from Mexico City). There is space for 6 technicians from May 21-24. This is a two-day clinic and would require travel on Thursday the 21st and Sunday the 24th. On average, these clinics see around 400 people per day.

2) For those with mission clinic experience, there is a week-long experience available for 4 technicians to Panama City, Panama, September 5 – 12. This will be an intense experience, with more than 1,000 clients per day. Travel will occur on the 5th and the 12th. Screenings will occur on the 7th and 8th, and the 10th and

11th. Wednesday the 9th is an opportunity to sightsee and relax.


