

## 2016 Missouri Lions State Convention Guest Speaker CLEMENT F. KUSIAK PAST INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT



Clement F. Kusiak, of Linthicum, Maryland, USA, was elected to serve as president of The International Association of Lions Clubs at the association's 87<sup>th</sup> International Convention, held in Detroit, Michigan, USA/Windsor, Ontario, Canada, on July 5 - 9, 2004.

Past President Kusiak is an engineer by profession and a retired manager for a corporation in Baltimore, Maryland.

A member of the Baltimore Brooklyn Lions Club since 1966, Past President Kusiak served as an international director on the association's board of directors from 1988 to 1990. Past President Kusiak was a member of the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum Planning Committee. He was also program chairperson for the Lions Eye Health Program (LEHP) and advisor for the national rollout, as well as chairperson of the District Governors-elect School in 2001-02.

In recognition of his service to the association, Past President Kusiak has received numerous awards, including the 100% Club President Award, the 100% District Governor's Award, an Extension award, four International President's Leadership Awards, seven International President's Awards and the Ambassador of Good Will Award, the highest honor bestowed upon association members. He is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow. During his year as president, he received an honorary doctorate degree from two colleges – the Pennsylvania School of Optometry and ISFOA (Finance and Business Management College) in Italy.

In addition to his Lion activities, Past President Kusiak is active in numerous professional and community organizations. He has served on numerous committees, such as the Atlantic Region's North American Membership Program, the Development Task Force and the Heritage Committee of Baltimore, Maryland.

Past President Kusiak and his wife, Jeanne, also a progressive Melvin Jones Fellow, have two deceased sons, a grandson and a granddaughter.

2016 Proposed Changes to the Missouri Lions MD-26 Constitution and By-Laws

The following propositions have been reviewed and screened, and reflect amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Missouri Lions MD-26. They will be submitted to the voting delegates at the Multiple District Convention on April 30, 2016.

#### **PROPOSITION NO. 1**

A RESOLUTION TO UPDATE THE DUES FOR CAMPUS CLUBS MEMBERS THROUGHOUT MULTIPLE DISTRICT 26.

BE IT RESOLVED, that in Article III, Section 1 (a) of the Multiple District 26 By-Laws be amended to include the following:

Section 1. Total Per Capita Tax. (a) To provide necessary revenues for the State Lions activities, there shall be levied upon each Lion in each District (except members of Campus Clubs) an annual per capita tax of \$10.50; ...

There shall be levied upon each Lions member in a Campus Club in each District an annual per capita tax of \$6.00. Said per capita tax shall be payable in equal semi-annual installments.

AND Section 2 (b) of the Multiple District 26 By-Laws be added as follows:

\$6.00 per member of a Campus Club the annual per capita tax shall be forwarded by the District Cabinet
Secretary-Treasurer in semi-annual installments to the State Council Secretary-Treasurer and shall be divided
in the following proportions and placed in the following funds by the State Council Secretary-Treasurer: \$0.40
per year in the International Convention Fund; \$5.00 per year in the State Administrative Fund; \$0.40 per year
in the Missouri Lions All-State Band Fund; and \$0.20 per year in the International Candidates' Election Fund.

#### **PROPOSITION NO. 2**

A RESOLUTION TO RECOGNIZE ANY ANNUAL FUNCTIONS OR EVENTS ORGANIZED BY THE GLT (GLOBAL LEADERSHIP TEAM) AND/OR GMT (GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP TEAM) AS APPROVED STATE PROGRAMS FOR THE LIONS OF MISSOURI.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Article III, Section 7 (b) or the Multiple District 26 By-Laws, shall any annual function of event or program organized, administered and accomplished the GLT (Global Leadership Team) and/or the GMT (Global Membership Team) committees for the purpose of Lions development and training and Lions growth and retention be considered approved State programs for the Lions of Missouri.

Upon approval, these Committees shall be included in the list of approved State projects in the MD26 Policy Manual, Chapter 1, Section I.

PROPOSITION NO. 3

A RESOLUTION TO REPLACE THE PHRASE "RULES OF AUDIT" WITH "GENERAL REIMBURSEMENT POLICY" PER LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL OFFICIAL WORDING.

SHALL THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED?

BE IT RESOLVED, that in Article V, Section 2 (a) of the Multiple District 26 Constitution where the phrase "Rules of Audit" is used, the phrase "General Reimbursement Policy" be used instead.

#### **PROPOSITION NO. 4**

A RESOLUTION TO REPLACE THE PHRASE "RULES OF AUDIT" WITH "GENERAL REIMBURSEMENT POLICY" PER LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL OFFICIAL WORDING.

BE IT RESOLVED, that in Article III, Section 3 (d) and (e) of the Multiple District 26 By-Laws where the phrase "Rules of Audit" is used, the phrase "General Reimbursement Policy" be used instead.

#### **PROPOSITION NO. 5**

A RESOLUTION TO REPLACE TERM "SECOND VICE PRESIDENT" WITH "THIRD VICE PRESIDENT" TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL.

BE IT RESOLVED, that in Article VI, Section 7 (g)(4), Article X, Section 1 and Section 2 of the Multiple District 26 Constitution where the term "Second Vice President" is used, the phrase "Third Vice President" be used instead.

#### **PROPOSITION NO. 6**

A RESOLUTION TO REPLACE TERM "SECOND VICE PRESIDENT" WITH "THIRD VICE PRESIDENT" TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL.

BE IT RESOLVED, that in Article III, Section 6 (b) and Article IV, Section 2 of the Multiple District 26 By-Laws where the term "Second Vice President" is used, the phrase "Third Vice President" be used instead.

#### **PROPOSITION NO. 7**

A RESOLUTION TO INCLUDE WORDING ABOUT AUTOMATIC UPDATES TO THE CONSTITUTION TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL.

BE IT RESOLVED, that in Article XII of the Multiple District 26 Constitution, Section 3 be added:

Section 3. When amendments to the International Constitution and By-Laws are passed at the International Convention, any amendments that would have an effect on the Multiple District Constitution shall automatically be updated in this Multiple District Constitution at the close of the Multiple District Convention.

**PROPOSITION NO. 8** 

A RESOLUTION TO INCLUDE WORDING ABOUT AUTOMATIC UPDATES TO THE BY-LAWS TO BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL.

BE IT RESOLVED, that in Article VI of the Multiple District 26 By-Laws, Section 3 be added:

Section 3. When amendments to the International Constitution and By-Laws are passed at the International Convention, any amendments that would have an effect on the Multiple District By-Laws shall automatically be updated in this Multiple District By-Laws at the close of the Multiple District Convention.

#### **Leader Dogs for the Blind Update**

#### Phase 1 Complete, Phase 2 Underway and Phase 3 Starting Soon

New exterior and interior masonry walls go up in the south wing.

#### Phase 1



With just a few minor items to complete, we are checking this phase as "Complete."

For people driving past Leader Dog's campus, it looks like our new Canine Development Center is totally finished; but for those who venture to the back of the building, the fact that we are still mid-construction is very apparent. (See picture on the left above)

#### Phase 2

The new suites are more than two times larger than current kennels, so dogs will be able to cohabitate if desired.

This phase of the project includes the renovation of three villages in the south wing (one is complete and currently serving as material storage). The villages, which will house our dogs in training, will be outfitted with large living suites, multiple open air runs, and in-village grooming and enrichment areas.

A garage addition is included in this phase along with new duct work, a new air exchange system, and new electrical and plumbing.

## Phase 3 Starting in Late March



The mild Michigan winter has helped keep construction on track, which puts us in a good position to start phase three on schedule. During this final phase, the interiors of the training bays in the east wing of the building will be demolished and rebuilt with more villages for our dogs in training.





#### Recycled Glasses Bring Sight to Senegal Scholar

Education can be the difference between struggling to make ends meet and securing financial independence. But poor eyesight can become a barrier to education one must overcome to see the board at the front of the classroom, write notes or read textbooks. Kadidja Aidara, a student pursuing

her degree in biology at Cheikh Anta Diop University in Dakar, Senegal knows that all too well.

Throughout her life, Kadidja had maintained a strong focus in school. She studied hard, but difficulty seeing was making it more challenging for her to be successful in the classroom. Her mother took her to the eye doctor and Kadidja was prescribed glasses. Unfortunately, they could not afford the prescription.

A health screening day sponsored by non-profit Weer Africa in Bambilor, Senegal, however, changed Kadidja's life. Doctors with Weer Africa fit Kadidja for glasses and gave her a pair of donated and recycled spectacles from Saving Sight's Eyeglass Recycling Program.

"You could see the joy on her face. It's very rewarding how one pair of glasses will make her life better," said Fatou Faye, President of Weer Africa.

Kadidja excitedly told Fatou during the screening that day, 'I'm going to college now and hopefully I will do much better this year.'

Over 500 people attended Weer Africa's January 2 health screening in Bambilor, including the mayor. Participants were screened for a number of non-communicable health concerns and vision impairments. Saving Sight provided Weer Africa 160 pairs of glasses through our Eyeglass Recycling Program to distribute on the humanitarian trip.

"We love working with Saving Sight and hopefully we have a partnership that keeps growing," said Fatou. "It helps our mission so much. The glasses are the one thing they are excited about the most."

Fatou pointed out the average pair of eyeglasses costs around \$200. That cost puts eyeglasses out of reach for many in Senegal where a doctor may earn \$500 a month and a teacher may earn \$150 per month. With the help of Lions Clubs who donate used glasses they collect, Saving Sight's Eyeglass Recycling Program helps save sight for those who might not otherwise have access to corrective eyewear.
